
## Format for the day

This term we have restarted the 'Garden to Table' programme. The students have been split into a junior and senior team, where each fortnight they get to plan, build and construct our new garden beds. We aim to have them planted up by the end of the term and start the cooking in term 3.

#### What is Garden to Table?

Garden to Table is a nationwide charitable trust. We enable schools and kura throughout the motu to deliver, embed and sustain impactful food education. Through our curriculum-linked food education programme, we take learning out of the classroom, and empower Kiwi kids to grow and cook their own fresh, seasonal, and environmentally sustainable kai.

#### How does the programme work?

Garden to Table sessions happen regularly throughout the year, with some tamariki working in the garden and some working in the kitchen. Tamariki observe the changing seasons and full food cycle and how planting, harvesting, and cooking change to reflect seasonality. At the end of each session, the garden and kitchen teams come together to share kai with their teachers and volunteer helpers.
